About the project Hortus Ignotus

The national participation of Cyprus at the 23rd Triennale Milano International Exhibition entitled *Unknown Unknowns*. *An Introduction to Mysteries*, has been assigned by the Deputy Ministry of Culture - Cultural Services and the Cyprus Architects Association to the curatorial collective formed by Christiana Ioannou, Daphne Kokkini, Spyros Nasainas and Christos Papastergiou. The curators, based in Cyprus, Greece and Switzerland, responding to the overall theme of the Triennale, conceived and designed *Hortus Ignotus*, an installation which reintroduces the idea of the enclosed garden as a condition that can be both curated and unknown.

As they state in their proposal: "The garden, as a typology of the domestic space has developed historically in Cyprus and the wider Mediterranean area. The gardens of Nicosia appear so often in travelers' narratives, and the accounts are so lyrically refined, that it seems as if the garden was informally recorded as the most important hidden element of the city, its 'common secret'. The physical as well as the typological elements that constitute the nicosian garden, become the tools of our investigation and negotiation with the unknown, whether this lies inside the perimeter or is even embedded in the garden walls. We acknowledge the garden as a primary element that condenses archetypal features of domesticity and the relationship of humans with the environment, while, at the same time it reflects religious and metaphysical perceptions of what lies beyond in the idea of paradise."

Hortus Ignotus consists of an audiovisual spatial installation that will trigger the physical and intellectual experience of the visitor, aiming to redefine the garden as a place for contemplation as well as introspection, a place that can be multisensory but also reflective, a threshold for the transition from the familiar to the imaginary and unknown.

About the 23rd International Exhibition

The 23rd Triennale Milano International Exhibition, entitled Unknown Unknowns. An Introduction to Mysteries, opens on July 15 and runs until December 11, 2022. By examining the theme of the unknown, exploring "what we don't know we don't know", through a constellation of exhibitions, installations and special projects, the 23rd International Exhibition expands our vision into what remains outside of our understanding: from the far reaches of outer space to the depths of the oceans, from the mysteries of consciousness to the environment we live in.

Daphne Kokkini (*1978 in Athens) is an architect and visual artist based in Zurich. She studied architecture in Athens and Urban Design at the ETH in Zürich (IKY Scholar). She initiated WERKRAUM as a platform for creative collaborations in 2015 and its extension, werkraum ceramics, in 2019. Daphne Kokkini has collaborated as a designer in numerous architectural, landscaping and urban projects, receiving awards and special mentions. She has been invited as guest lecturer and published articles in internationally reknowned editions.

Her projects range from landscape and urban design to site-specific installations, scenography, film and performance. She perceives them as narratives deriving from cross-cultural observations on places, people and the interaction between them. Interested in creating projects which have an anthropocentric character, she often borrows elements as much from daily routines as well as from historical-archival sources or literature. As a freelance artist she has presented her work on several contexts, including the Athens & Epidaurus Festival, Zürich Theaterspektakel, Living Room Festival and in private galleries in Greece and Switzerland. She is a founder member of Terrasse Ensemble, Performance Network and the collective project, das Schwarzenbach Komplex, both based in Zürich. She is member of Visarte (Association of Visual Artists) and has recently been selected as one of the artists in Residence for the year 2022 by the Foundation Nairs in Switzerland.

The team crafts, documents and communicates new ideas with the use of drawings, images, model making and text while sharing interests between public competitions, private commissions, exhibitions, design research and academic teaching. The team has been awarded prizes in numerous competitions, among them the a 2nd prize for a school complex in Palermo (in collaboration with Autonomeforme), an MIT award for the project 'The New Zidonians' and a 1st prize for the project 'MUUSA' at the 'Next Helsinki' Architecture Ideas Competition curated by Michael Sorkin. Work of the studio has been published and exhibited worldwide, such as the Venice Architecture Biennale 2008 and 2012, the Bauwelt magazine, the Site magazine, the Blueprint magazine and has recently featured in the 'ATLAS of Emerging Practices' book among other 94 architecture offices from 22 European countries.
